Thomas G. Slaughter, a Knoxville, Tennessee Attorney, who was licensed to practice law in 1988. He has a J.D. degree from the University of Tennessee College of Law. He has handled a variety of both civil and criminal cases ranging from personal injury cases to death penalty cases. He meets the requirements to serve as both Lead Counsel and Co-Counsel in death penalty cases.

Barry L. Rice, a graduate of the University of Tennessee, is a Tennessee licensed private investigator and has been a criminal defense investigator for the past 15 years. Over his career, he has been the lead investigator in over 1,000 state and federal criminal cases, including 18 death penalty cases. A member of the Tennessee Professional Investigators Association and the International Association of Arson Investigators.

William C. Talman, a Knoxville, Tennessee Attorney, who was licensed to practice law in 1986, has handled numerous jury trials, including several first degree murder and other serious felony jury trials. He has been Lead Counsel in several capital murder cases and has tried death penalty cases to a jury verdict. He has handled both the guilt and sentencing phases of capital murder litigation and has extensive experience in jury selection and voir dire. In addition to meeting the requirements to serve as Lead Counsel, he meets the requirements to serve as Co-Counsel, Appellate and Post Conviction Counsel in capital murder cases and is admitted to practice before the Supreme Court of the United States. He is the author of *Tennessee Criminal Trial Motions Practice*, (ISBN 0-9651848-5-4).

Wade Bobo Columbus, Retired from the Office of the District Public Defender for the 23rd Judicial District. He graduated from the University of Tennessee School of Law in 1969. Since that date, he served in the J.A.G. in Vietnam, working on the Lt. Calley case, 14 years as a prosecutor, and the balance of that time as a defense attorney. He has handled over 20 murder cases and 7 death penalty cases.
